

**The Therapeutic Interventionist must:**

- Possess a BSW or Bachelor's degree in a related field. (MSW Preferred)
- Have experience in working with youth and families.
- Maintain confidentiality.
- Be willing to travel to provide field-based services.
- Possess strong communication skills, both written and verbal, and excellent interpersonal skills.
- Work effectively as a member of a team and as an independent leader.
- Be able to build strong community partnerships and collaborate with MCP partners to develop and implement strategies for positive community change.
- Possess strong computer skills in Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint

**The Therapeutic Interventionist will:**

- Provide school-based ACEs screenings and follow-up therapeutic supports.
- Establish formal referral pathways to MOUD providers, offer community-based overdose prevention education, stigma reduction presentations, and Naloxone distribution and education services.
- Work directly within the existing SBIRT program with a new targeted focus on ACEs screening and follow-up mitigation strategies.
- Provide evidence-based **LifeSkills Training (LST)** program for youth in elementary, middle, and high school-aged youth and adult LST programs.
- Work in the community to create formal referral pathways to MOUD providers, offer community-based Naloxone trainings and stigma reduction presentations.
- Help to publicize and promote West Virginia online and mail-order Naloxone distribution program information on in-person monthly Project HEAL education and dissemination events through social media, and as part of award announcement project updates in local news media
